

**CRITERIA FOR PFIZER GRANTS TO POTENTIAL
PARALYMPIANS**

1. Your application will be assessed by the panel taking into account input from the governing body of your sport, where applicable, and the panel's judgement will be final. There will be 3 deadlines a year on 1 March, 1 June and 1 November, after which the panel will meet. Please ensure you apply well in advance of when you require support, indicating any dates for national/international events or training wherever possible.
2. The fund is small in scale, with limited amounts available three times a year and therefore we must warn applicants that it may not be possible to fulfil all requests.
3. Maximum grant available is £400.00 (dependent on funds available and number of applications).
 - a) Funding is for performers only and is not available for parents or coaches.
 - b) Only up to 50% of travel/training costs/entrance fees/specialist equipment costs can be granted.
4. Individuals can only apply for one grant in any one year.
5. Funding cannot be retrospectively awarded for events and training which has already taken place or equipment costs already incurred.
6. Funding can be given for specialist equipment, travelling and training costs to national and international events. Funding

cannot be given for personal clothing. (For example training shoes would not be funded but running spikes may be.)

7. There must be a demonstrable financial need. Funding will not be given or may be reduced if there is a significant amount of financial support from another source.
8. Recipients will need to provide a report and photo 6 weeks after the event/project.

Conditions

- National governing bodies of sport may be consulted to assist in the prioritisation of applications in the event that several applications are made by performers from the same sport.
- As a recipient of a grant you will be required to promote the fact that you have been supported by Pfizer and Kent County Council's Sports Development Unit.
- Kent County Council and Pfizer reserve the right to withdraw or re-claim part or all of an award, if any information provided is found to be inaccurate or the award is not used for the purposes for which it was given.
